Lest We Forget, the day to honour all our war veterans. While COVID-19 is creating a war on our nation today, we shall not forget those who fought to give us the freedom to be here today.

Keeping ourselves and our community safe during these precedent times helps to alleviate pressures on our families, businesses and health care centers. While our larger urban centers experiencing growth rates related to the pandemic I commend our community and citizens for continuing to practice social distancing, using a mask when you cannot social distance, practicing good hygiene – washing your hands often and cover coughs and sneezes. Monitor symptoms for those of us over the age of 18 – stuffy nose, painful swallowing, chills, headache, muscle or joint aches, feeling unwell or fatigued, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or unexplained loss of appetite, loss of sense of smell or taste, “pink eye”. Staying home if you do not feel well, avoiding non-essential travel and getting the flu shot. By getting yourself vaccinated, reduces the burden on our health care workers treating influenza cases so that they may concentrate on the COVID-19 pandemic.

While our residents continue practicing these measures the Flagstaff region is open and our businesses and recreation centers are functioning.

As a region many of our urban neighbors continue to work together to establish cost savings through partnerships and build on efficiencies. Town of Hardisty Council renewed their agreement to partner with other municipalities in Flagstaff

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by agreeing to work together in a “new” Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership (FIP). The new FIP will concentrate on creating efficiencies and solving problems experienced by all members, generate additional revenue, enhance service levels of the members, and promote common interests through joint advocacy. Areas that the members will concentrate on are: corporate, protective, infrastructure, planning & community services.

The Flagstaff Intermunicipal Assessment Review Board and the Intermunicipal Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Agreements have been amended to take on another partnering municipality the Village of Amisk. Now there will be 10 municipalities all using the same Board members to facilitate the requirements of the Municipal Government Act by saving costs for training more Board members when we can share these costs.

Council accepted the engineering proposal from Morrison Hershfield in the amount of \$118,100 for the 48th Street Refurbishment Project which is our 2021 capital project. Morrison Hershfield also provided Council with an updated estimate on the cost for this project which included a 20% contingency and goods and services tax at a total estimated cost of \$3.9M.

The Town of Hardisty will also receive from the Province a Municipal Operating Support Transfer (MOST) Grant in the amount of \$61,097. This new grant program is to assist municipalities as part of the Safe Restart Agreement between Alberta and the Government of Canada. Municipalities are only required to execute the funding agreement and ensure that the funds are used to support additional costs or revenue shortfalls associated with the COVID-19 pandemic and actions taken in response to it.

Thank you to the Battle River Community Foundation for once again choosing to support the Hardisty Cemetery, Hardisty Lakeview Golf Course, Hardisty Fire & Rescue Dept, and Hardisty Community Hall.

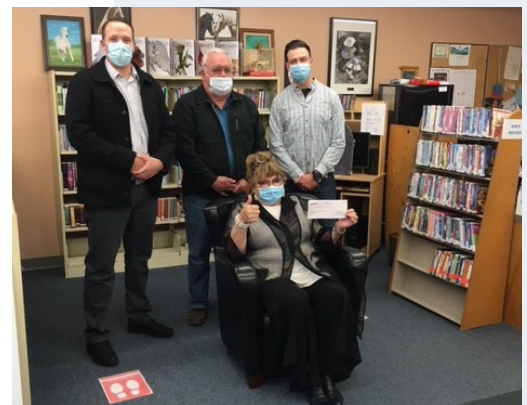
