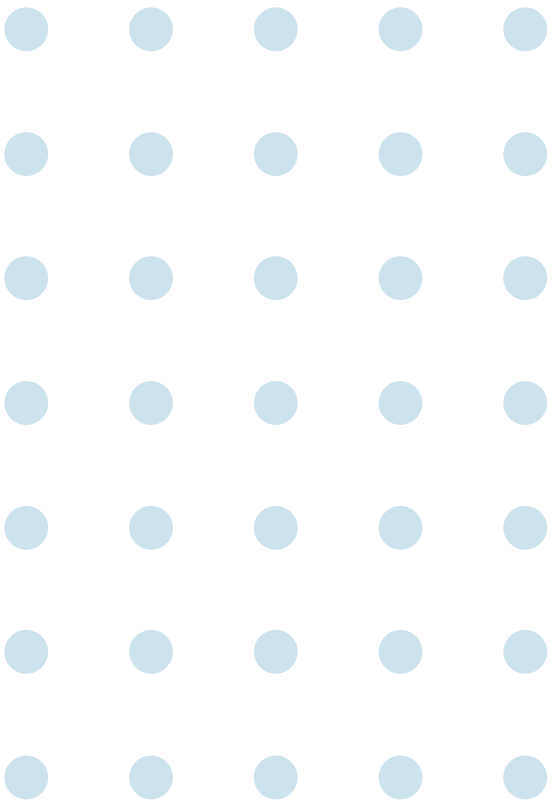

Inspired by the 100 Women Who Care movement in the USA, a group of women decided to bring the idea to Flagstaff County.

Each woman or team of women write a \$100 cheque, receives her voting ballot and watches how her \$100 donation to the winning organization along with the rest of the group's commitment turns into a \$10,000 or more donation for one local organization.

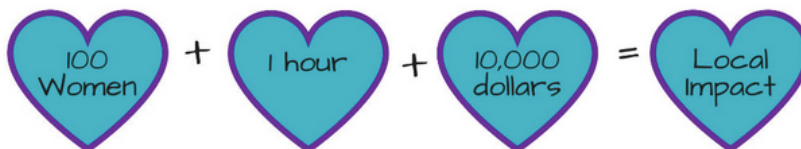
With four meetings a year and 100% honored pledges, we can witness how \$40,000 or more can improve the lives of our neighbours when placed in the hands of deserving organizations working to serve the Flagstaff Region. In just 3 years, our organization has donated 145,000 to deserving groups in the Flagstaff region! Astounding!
