

Public Works Corner



In this month's newsletter we will talk about water meters and water consumption.

Water meters consist of two working parts:

- 1. The Body this part contains a plastic or nylon impeller which is fastened to a magnet. As the flow of water moves through the meter, the impeller turns the magnet which registers the usage. Notice the word 'flow;" when there is no flow, there is no spinning, therefore no usage. There must be flow through a meter for it to turn.
- 2. The Electronic Head this part reads how much the magnet turns. If the magnet is not turning, the head cannot read usage.

Both parts are calibrated at the manufacturer, either they work, or they do not. Meaning, if a meter "fails" it will not spin, and therefore will have no "usage" to read. A meter cannot speed up on its own unless there is an increase in flow.

Citizen of the Month

Thank you so very much for all your help with neighbouring yards! Your efforts are appreciated by all!

The water can only be used on the customer side of the meter. A leak underground will not affect the meter reading, as the water has not passed the impeller/magnet.

So, what is high usage, or what can cause that? The obvious culprits are leaky taps, leaky toilets, or leaking valves (yes even outside taps can leak and cause issues)

Other practices that can cause high usage on a meter reading are:

- Watering lawns and gardens, flowers, and trees
- Laundry or Washing dishes
- Washing equipment or vehicles
- Long showers or baths in hot sticky weather
- Filling kid's pools or cooling off a furry friend

All these practices can add up in a hurry and many times water is used but never mindfully recalled. Meters are read once a month, electronically, so the only time the town physically handles parts of a meter is if there is a "no read" in the software which triggers a need for a repair. If this occurs, a public works team member will contact you to arrange replacement of the malfunctioning parts.

It is very important to exercise your shut off valve once a year. Your shut off valve is usually located beside the meter. This is very important, as it enables you to shut the water off in your home while you are away, or should the meter need repairing, the water can be shut off and allow the repairs to be completed.

As we enter the fall season, a reminder to all customers whose meter is not inside, that you (as an owner) are required to ensure that heat traces are working, and the meters are properly insulated or heated. The "town" provides connection to the water source at the cc valve, which is located near the curb. The owner is responsible for water supply systems up to and including the meter. Damaged and frozen meters will be replaced; however, it will be at the owner's expense.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION to be filed for approval of the natural gas distribution franchise agreement between the Town of Hardisty and ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd.

Application summary:

The Alberta Utilities Commission expects to receive an application from ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. to approve the existing current and valid natural gas distribution franchise agreement with the Town of Hardisty. This application for approval is required due to changes made by the Utilities Affordability Statutes Amendment Act, 2024, to various statutes governing franchise agreements.

The current franchise agreement, which took effect in January of 2018, grants ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. the exclusive right to deliver natural gas to the residents of Hardisty for approximately ten years.

No changes to the franchise agreement or to the franchise fee rate rider percentage are being made as part of this application. The franchise fee rate rider percentage will remain at its current rate, which is 22%. Including linear taxes, the resulting average monthly franchise fee for an average residential customer will remain the same at approximately \$13.32. The franchise fee is calculated based on distribution charges. An average residential customer uses about 105 gigajoules per year.



Each parcel will be offered for sale, subject to a reserve bid and to the reservations and conditions contained in the existing certificate of title.

The Town of Hardisty may, after the public auction, become the owner of any parcel of land not sold at the public auction.

Terms: Any property selling for less than \$25,000 will be considered a "cash sale" and all funds are due and payable via bank draft, certified cheque, VISA, Mastercard, Debit Card, or cash, the day of purchase. Any property selling over \$25,000 will require a minimum of 15% down by way of cash, certified cheque, bank draft, VISA, Mastercard, or Debit Card immediately preceding the purchase that day. A letter of credit must accompany the 15% down from a recognized financial institution for the difference indicating that the buyer has been approved for funding in an amount equal to or greater than the purchase price. Balance of proceeds to be netted in 30 days. All unsightly conditions on these properties will need to be dealt with, within 15 days of the completed purchase at the new owner's expense.
