

### What is a Land Use Bylaw?

A Land Use Bylaw directs the use and development of lands and buildings through development permits. By establishing land use districts (zoning), the LUB regulates the types of activities and buildings that can occur on any specific property.

It also contains regulations such as maximum building height and parcel coverage, corner lots and reverse corner lots, and building setbacks from property lines.

# Why does the Town need a Land Use Bylaw?

Provincial legislation requires every municipality in Alberta to have a Land Use Bylaw. A Land Use Bylaw is the tool used to implement the long-term vision of the Hardisty Municipal Development Plan on a day-day-today basis.

# Why is the Land Use Bylaw being updated?

Land Use Bylaws are living documents that are amended or replaced on a regular basis to stay current with community needs and desires. The Town of Hardisty is aiming to create a simplified and more user-friendly Land Use Bylaw.





### What is the process for preparing a new Land Use Bylaw?

A major update to a Land Use Bylaw can take up to a year to complete. It requires research, meetings and discussions, a lot of writing, getting input from the Hardisty community, more revisions, and finally – the Council approval process. Below shows the proposed timeline.



### How can I provide input?

You can provide suggestion and comments on the draft Land Use Bylaw at the open house. All feedback will be included in a "What we Heard" report and considered for making further changes to the Land Use Bylaw prior to the Council approval process. You can also attend the Public Hearing and provide your comments directly to Hardisty Council in the Council approval process.

### What role does Town of Hardisty Council play?

Council must give three readings to a bylaw before it is passed, and in the case of a Land Use Bylaw, a Public Hearing must be held before second reading is given. Council can make changes to the bylaw at any of the three readings.

#### Killam / Forestburg RCMP shares tips to protect against fraud

Killam, Alta. – Killam / Forestburg RCMP reminds residents about the importance of staying vigilant as more of our daily activities \ take place online and over the phone. With the rise in digital communication, fraudsters are finding new ways to scam unsuspecting victims.

Killam / Forestburg RCMP offers the following tips on how to protect yourself from online fraud and scams:

- Protect your computer and accounts, and be cautious of urgent-looking pop-ups and suspicious
  emails with spelling or formatting errors.
- Don't click on unknown links or attachments.
- Use anti-virus software and keep your operating system up to date.
- · Secure your online accounts with strong and unique passwords.
- Do not use the same password for numerous accounts.
- Don't be afraid to say no. If a caller pressures you to buy something or send money immediately, hang up. Scammers often create a sense of urgency to manipulate victims.
- Confirm the legitimacy of businesses by checking official websites and contacting them directly before you act. If someone calls about a family member in trouble, reach out to others before acting.
- Guard your personal information and never share personal details (name, address, birthdate, banking info, etc.) unless you initiated the contact. You never know who's on the other end of an unsolicited call or message.
- Beware of upfront fees. In Canada, legitimate prizes do not require fees or taxes to claim.
- If you didn't enter a contest, you're not a winner.

#### Killam / Forestburg RCMP warns businesses to watch for gift card scams

Killam, Alta. – Killam / Forestburg RCMP is reminding businesses and employees to stay vigilant against gift card fraud. Fraudsters often pressure victims into purchasing large quantities of gift cards as a form of payment, using emotional manipulation or threats.

Killam / Forestburg RCMP is encouraging businesses to help protect customers from financial loss by watching for these warning signs of gift card scams:

- A customer wants to purchase a large number of gift cards, especially in high denominations.
- The customer appears anxious, confused, or in a rush.
- The customer insists they must complete the purchase immediately and is unwilling to answer questions.
- The purchase is being made with instructions from someone over the phone.

If you suspect a customer may be a victim of a gift card scam, take a moment to ask:

- Have you met the person you are buying these for?
- Is this payment for taxes, police fines, a lottery prize, or an emergency?
- Did someone contact you by phone or online asking for these cards?

If the answer is "yes" to any of these, encourage the customer to stop and contact their local police before proceeding.

Fraudsters often use these common scams:

- Government or law enforcement scams where the victim is told they owe taxes or fines and must pay immediately.
- Romance scams where the scammer is pretending to be a romantic partner and requests gift cards as a form of financial help.
- Prize scams where the victim is told they won a lottery or contest but must pay taxes or fees first.
- Emergency scams where the fraudster pretends to be a relative or friend in urgent need of money.

Businesses play a key role in preventing fraud by staying alert and questioning suspicious transactions. If you suspect fraud, advise the customer to call their local police before making a purchase.

### Killam / Forestburg RCMP urging seatbelt safety in rural and remote areas

Killam, Alta. – Killam / Forestburg RCMP is asking motorists and their passengers to wear seatbelts. Proper use of a vehicle's safety restraint can reduce the likelihood of death or serious injury if a collision occurs.

Killam / Forestburg RCMP encourages drivers and passengers to remember the following when it comes to seatbelt safety:

- Seatbelts must be worn by all occupants of a vehicle.
- The lap portion of the seatbelt should be snug across your hips, with the shoulder belt resting across the middle of your chest. Be sure the seatbelt is not twisted, and the latching mechanism moves freely along the belt itself.
- Wear a seatbelt even when you're on backroads, private property, or only traveling a short distance.
- Motorists are responsible for ensuring both themselves and passengers under the age of 16years-old are using proper occupant restraints.
- Fines for seatbelt infractions is \$162
- It is recommended that seatbelts be worn when riding an off-road vehicle, if the vehicle comes equipped.

### Killam / Forestburg RCMP encourages the public to report aggressive or dangerous driving

Killam, Alta. - Aggressive driving, including speeding, tailgating, and unsafe lane changes, puts everyone on the road at risk. Whether you're witnessing aggressive behaviour or feeling frustrated behind the wheel yourself, knowing how to respond can help prevent dangerous situations.

Killam / Forestburg RCMP encourages motorists to remember the following in order to reduce the risks of aggressive and dangerous driving:

- Reduce stress by leaving yourself extra time for your commute.
- Drive within the speed limit, following the rules of the road and respecting other drivers.
- If you witness aggressive driving, avoid retaliation and do not engage in further aggressive driving behaviours.
- If you are approached by an individual during an aggressive driving incident, remain in your vehicle with the doors locked. Leave when safe to do so and report the incident to police.
- If you are involved in or witness an incident of aggressive driving, report details to the police. Be prepared to provide the vehicle colour, make, model, license plate number and a description of the driver to police.
- If you are ever in immediate danger during an aggressive driving incident, call 911.
